CETALC 2024 Grants Narrative

Diocesan Grants

Province IX Dioceses:

Diocese of Colombia – Center for Theological Studies (CET in Spanish) – General formation program for clergy and Laity. Target: 25 clergy, seminarians and laity. Purpose: To provide information and knowledge to clergy, lay ministers, seminarians and individuals coming from other denominations. Approved: \$9,000.

Diocese of Ecuador Litoral – San Patricio Center for Theological Studies. Target: 9 clergy, 18 seminarians, 300 laity, 7 licensed lay ministers. Purpose: To strengthen the training of clergy and lay ministers. Approved: \$10,000.

Diocese of Honduras: Diocesan Theological Education Program. Target: 60 clergy, 24 seminarians, 10 laity, 1 student. Purpose: Formation focused on Sacred Orders. Approved: \$10,000.

Diocese of Dominican Republic – Theological Education Center. Target: 48 clergy, 9 seminarians, 120 laity, 40 pastoral leaders and School of Christian information guides. Purpose: Continued theological formation for clergy and laity of the diocese. Approved: \$10,000.

Anglican Church in Central America Dioceses - IARCA:

Diocese of Costa Rica – Center for Theological Studies of the Episcopal Church of Costa Rica (CETIEC in Spanish). Target: 18 clergy, 25 laity. Purpose: Continued education for pastoral leaders, responding to the needs of the social context of the churches with leaders trained in Bible, Ministry, liturgy, and mission. Approved: \$10,000.

Diocese of El Salvador - Episcopal Anglican Seminary of El Salvador Target: 5 clergy, 60 laity, 6 seminarians, 14 aspirants. Purpose: To strengthen the life of the Church through continued theological education for clergy, seminarians, and laity. Approved: \$10,000.00

Diocese of Guatemala – Continued Education Program and Christian Theological Formation. Target: 38 clergy, 11 seminarians, 25 laity. Purpose: Prepare a class of new clergy, continue professional formation of clergy, and offer laity opportunities for study and reflection. Approved: \$10,000.

Diocese of Nicaragua – Anglican Theological Seminary. Target: 10 clergy, 30 laity, 1 deacon, 1 RC priest. Purpose: Theological Education Program to increase the missionary expansion of the diocese. Approved: 10,000.

Diocese of Panama – Total Ministry Program. Target: 21 clergy, 3 seminarians, 45 laity, 50 youth. Purpose: Present ordained ministry as an option to the youth; continued education for clergy focus on Anglican identity. Approved: \$10,000.

Anglican Church of Mexico Dioceses

Diocese of Cuernavaca – Lay Leadership “Following the Call”. Target: 5 clergy, 3 seminarians, 40 laity. Purpose: To develop and strengthen clerical and lay leadership post pandemic. Approved: \$9,000.

Diocese of Mexico – San Andres Seminary. Target: 29 clergy, 9 seminarians, 80 laity, 20 others. Purpose: Training of clergy and lay leaders who participate actively in parishes and missions. Approved: \$10,000.

Diocese of Northern Mexico – Programa Camino e Instituto de Educación. Target: 22 clergy, 6 seminarians, 39 laity. Purpose: Promote, strengthen and continue theological education for different ministries. Make more professional and accessible for clergy and laity. Approved: \$10,000.

Diocese of Western Mexico – San Andres Theological Studies Center. Target: 6 clergy, 7 seminarians, 21 laity. Purpose: Support diocesan development through the training of future clergy and lay leaders with abilities and aptitudes needed to plant and grow congregations. Approved: \$10,000.

Diocese of Southeast Mexico – Jose G. Saucedo Theological Institute. Target: 12 clergy, 17 seminarians, 30 laity, 8 aspirants to ministry. Purpose: Identity based theological formation for ministry aspirants and clergy; update on topics relevant to diocesan mission and community pastoral leadership for laity. Approved: \$7,760.

Province II Diocese:

Diocese of Cuba – New Authorized Ministries. Target: 30 laity. Purpose: Three workshops for training and preparation of lay leaders for authorized ministries. Approved: \$10,000.

Episcopal Anglican Church of Brazil Dioceses:

Diocese of Brasilia – United in God’s Mission. Target: 14 clergy, 12 seminarians, 35 laity. Purpose: To sensitize and train clergy in reconciliation, dignity of life and integral health. Guarantee the human rights of all people. Approved: \$10,000.

Diocese of Parana - Christian and Theological Education. Target: 10 clergy, 30 laity, 10 others. Purpose: to train ordain and lay persons for mission. Approved: \$10,000.

Diocese of Pelotas – Continued formation for leaders clergy and laity. Target: 10 clergy, 6 seminarians, 25 laity, 100 others. Purpose: to train clergy and lay leaders by continued education. Approved: \$10,000.

Diocese of Recife – Target: 21 clergy, 20 laity, 100 others. Purpose: This is a new program that seeks to provide practical pastoral and missionary formation to the regions of the diocese in the northeast of Brazil, sending clergy with pastoral and missional experience, for a period, to offer in person practical training to clergy and laity of the region. \$10,000.

Diocese of Rio de Janeiro – Biblical Theological Institute. Target: 25 clergy, 10 seminarians, 100 laity, 60 other dioceses. Purpose: To offer theological education training for lay ministers and clergy. Extend the participation of clergy and laity in the life of the community. Approved: \$10,000.

Diocese of Sao Paulo – Integral formation for clergy and laity. Target: 20 clergy, 8 seminarians, 55 laity. Purpose: To provide an update on current biblical theological thinking for clergy and laity. Approved: \$9000.

Provincial Scholarships

Anglican Church in the Central Region of America (IARCA in Spanish) – Anglican Center of Higher Theological Studies (CAETS in Spanish). Target: 30 clergy, 10 laity, 10 lay professors in different programs. Purpose: Training the teachers to reach a provincial level of high pedagogy in each of the diocesan seminaries. Approved: \$33,900.

Anglican Church of Mexico – Continued formation for clergy and laity. Target: 110 clergy, 25 seminarians, 50 laity. Purpose: Provide opportunities for learning, study, reflection, and spiritual growth for the clergy and people of the province, based on Anglican theological and liturgical formation resources. Approved: \$12,450.

Episcopal Anglican Church of Brazil – Create Egmont Krischke Theological Faculty in the modality of Distance Learning. Target: 120 clergy, 40 seminarians, 70 laity, 60 others. Purpose: Establish course of higher education for a Bachelor of Theology in the modality of distance learning oriented in the Anglican tradition. Approved: \$35,000.

Research and Production in Theological Education Field

Roberto Armas Salazar – Diocese of Guatemala. Prison Ministry. Research seeks to encourage the dioceses in IARCA to take the message of peace and serenity to persons deprived of their freedom. Approved: \$4,125.

Diego Fernando Sabogal Gutierrez Diocese of the Dominican Rep. Resource Production. To create contents based in Sacred Scriptures that encourage a life following the Bible that is necessary in our Episcopal spirituality and charism. Approved: \$5,000.

Humberto Maiztegui Gonzalves – Diocese Meridional - Porto Alegre. Research in Anglican Mariology: Theology and Spirituality. To promote collective research and publication of material on Anglican Mariology with participation of lay persons, postulants, and interested clergy. Approved: \$3,420.

Post Graduate Academic Studies

Eduardo Arturo Carrasco Gomez – Diocese of Mexico. Toward a master’s degree on the History of the Church in Mexico – focus on the 2nd decade of the 20th Century: the Cristera War. Approved: \$25,000. Fifty percent disbursed in 2024 and the other fifty percent in 2025.
